

Coronavirus

Following on from the Cobra meeting held by Government yesterday the country has now entered the delay phase of the Government's plans to slow the spread of the virus. The Prime Minister was clear that schools would remain open for the time being, which is a decision we support.

As you would expect we continue to act on incoming information from the Department for Education and from Public Health England. We are following all available advice, particularly around hygiene and are meeting regularly to ensure that we are prepared for all emerging eventualities.

If the school is directed to close by the Government and your child has to stay at home, our plan is that teachers will communicate with your child and set work using Class Dojo and the school Facebook page. Whilst there is no substitute for learning in the classroom we will do all we can to ensure your child's education continues as normally as possible. If your child does NOT know their username and/or password, please encourage them to ask their Form Tutor.

Following Government advice on overseas trips, these will be cancelled. Refunds will be issued asap. With regards to exams, the planned timetable is still being followed but it is an ever changing situation that we will advise upon should things change.

We are resisting the temptation to send you detailed communications because they are likely to be subject to change as we are overtaken by changing guidance or events. For now, please reassure children that business is continuing as usual and that all precautions are being taken to protect them.
