Zoo2u visit for Year 3 and Jaguars' science

Year 3 and Jaguars met Tojo, a Tenrec from Madagascar; Curly, a Giant Millipede; Bo a Barn Owl; Willow the skunk and Babe a Western Hog-nose snake.

The children found out lots of information about the animals including whether they had exo- or endoskeletons; what foods they ate- and what eats them and what their habitats were like. We learnt interesting facts about the animals such as the tiny tenrec (which looks like a hedgehog) is actually related to an elephant and the hog-nosed snake can pretend to be dead to keep predators away. We were also quite relieved to hear the Skunk only sprays when it thinks its life is in danger, which is just as well as it can be smelt over a mile away when it does.

The children were very interested, asked lots of really good questions and got to stroke each animal, which was an amazing experience.
