## Keeping the children safe

It seems that we need to issue yet another reminder about the fact that it is **illegal to** park or stop on the yellow zig zag lines anywhere. Rule 243 of the Highway code indicates where motorists must not park or stop.

Despite a message on the newsletter on 9.9.22, some parents have ignored the warning and continue to put the children's lives at risk by doing this. Parking or stopping on the zig zag lines is highly dangerous as it obstructs the visibility. Stopping on the zig zag lines to let your child out is NOT acceptable.

We will continue to work with the local PCSO and police to manage and maintain the children's safety.

Our children's safety must come first.
